Despite the current challenging situation worldwide, we are delighted to officially introduce you to the new golf education and development CPG systems and services. Those of you attending last year's Annual Congress had the opportunity to hear about the conception of the project nicknamed "University of Golf", which has now entered a new stage.

Most importantly, we would like to invite you to a Zoom Webinar on Friday — 3 April at 12:00 (GMT+1), where a newly developed educational product - Parents in Golf - will be presented.

More on that later, but first let us present you with a short brief on the project and people behind it.

Why "University of Golf"?

Despite the incredible advances of the quality of education for golf professionals in recent years, golf in many countries is in decline. The EELS system, although definitely an aid in raising the quality of education, pushed for a unified framework across countries, which we no longer think is the right path. It is likely that each and every country, and in fact, each and every individual working in the golf industry, requires a different set of content and career pathways, designed for their own needs. For some emerging golfing countries, it may be that all that is really needed is just introductory education. Moreover, education should honour the tradition, culture and language of the country, and exist within national structures such as Qualifications Frameworks.

This is the focus of the "University of Golf" - to help countries and individuals access quality, flexible and internationally comparable education, especially in the areas related to golf development.

The goal is to introduce more people, and more diverse groups of people to the golfing community, reduce the "drop out" of existing golfers through diverse programme design and infrastructural adjustments, as well as to develop personal capabilities of all involved.

While the pedagogical and sports skills of the teaching staff have consistently developed to the highest level over the past 4 decades, inspiring, organising and managing new target groups in golf has received less attention up to now.

Some of the outputs we are hoping to achieve through the project in the upcoming months and years is an international educational platform, a range of educational and developmental offerings for countries and individuals and a clear, consumer-focused international categorisation system for individuals. All of this developed together with the national PGAs, for them and the whole golf community.

Project status

We are currently in the process of setting up the required structure for the project, as well as putting together an application to the Erasmus+ European Union fund to assist and provide funding towards the project.

However, at the same time, work has already been done on some of the future educational offerings, such as *Parents in Golf*, which you will be able to hear more about at the next week's Webinar as well as in future communication from us.

We will keep you informed on the current status of the project through e-mails like this on a regular basis.
